


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GAP 1: INCONSISTANT SAFETY TRAINING& LACK OF COMPETENCY CHECKS

X The Risks:

- O Employees may receive inconsistent safety training on workplace hazards, emergency procedures, or the proper use of personal protective equipment (PPE).
- O Lack of role-specific training means workers may not fully understand their health and safety responsibilities.
- O Without frequent competency checks, unsafe practices can go unnoticed, increasing the risk of workplace injuries.

Correction Strategies:

- O Ensure all employees complete mandatory health and safety training upon hire and at least annually. Document all training.
- O Provide role-specific training to ensure that both front-line workers and management understand their responsibilities.
- O Conduct prectical competency assessments on:
 - ☐ Proper PPE use, including donning and doffing procedures.
 - $\hfill\Box$ Safe operation of equipment and tools.
 - ☐ Emergency response procedures (fire drills, first aid, spill containment, etc.).

GAP 2: LACK OF PREPAREDNESS FOR WORKPLACE HAZARDS & EMERGENCIES

X The Risks:

- O Unclear protocols for handling workplace hazards can lead to preventable incidents.
- O Employees may not be properly trained on emergency procedures, including fire evacuations, chemical spills, and medical emergencies.
- O Inadequate PPE or emergency equipment (e.g., first aid kits, fire extinguishers, eye wash stations) can put employees at serious risk.

✓ Correction Strategies:

- O Develop and regularly review an emergency response plan tailored to your workplace.
- O Train employees on hazard identification, reporting procedures, and emergency response protocols.
- O Conduct regular safety drills to ensure preparedness.
- O Maintain an adequate stock of PPE, first aid supplies, and emergency equipment.



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GAP 3: INADEQUATE WORKPLACE INSPECTIONS & HAZARD ASSESSMENTS

X The Risks:

- O Failure to conduct regular workplace inspections can allow hazards to go undetected.
- O Lack of proper risk assessments can result in unsafe working conditions.
- O Poor incident reporting practices can prevent organizations from identifying and addressing recurring safety issues.

Correction Strategies:

- O Implement routine workplace inspections and hazard assessments to proactively identify risks.
- O Ensure all hazards are documented and corrective actions are taken promptly.
- O Encourage a culture of safety where employees feel comfortable reporting hazards and near misses.



GAP 4: INCOMPLETE DOCUMENTATION AND OUTDATED POLICIES

X The Risks:

- O Missing safety records and inspection logs make compliance verification difficult during audits or inspections.
- O Outdated or incomplete safety policies can result in repeated violations.
- O Lack of internal audits can leave workplaces unprepared for unannounced regulatory inspections.

Correction Strategies:

- O Maintain accurate and complete safety records, including training logs, inspection reports, and incident records.
- O Regularly review and update workplace safety policies to align with current regulations.
- O Conduct internal self-audits to ensure ongoing compliance and readiness for inspections.



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
