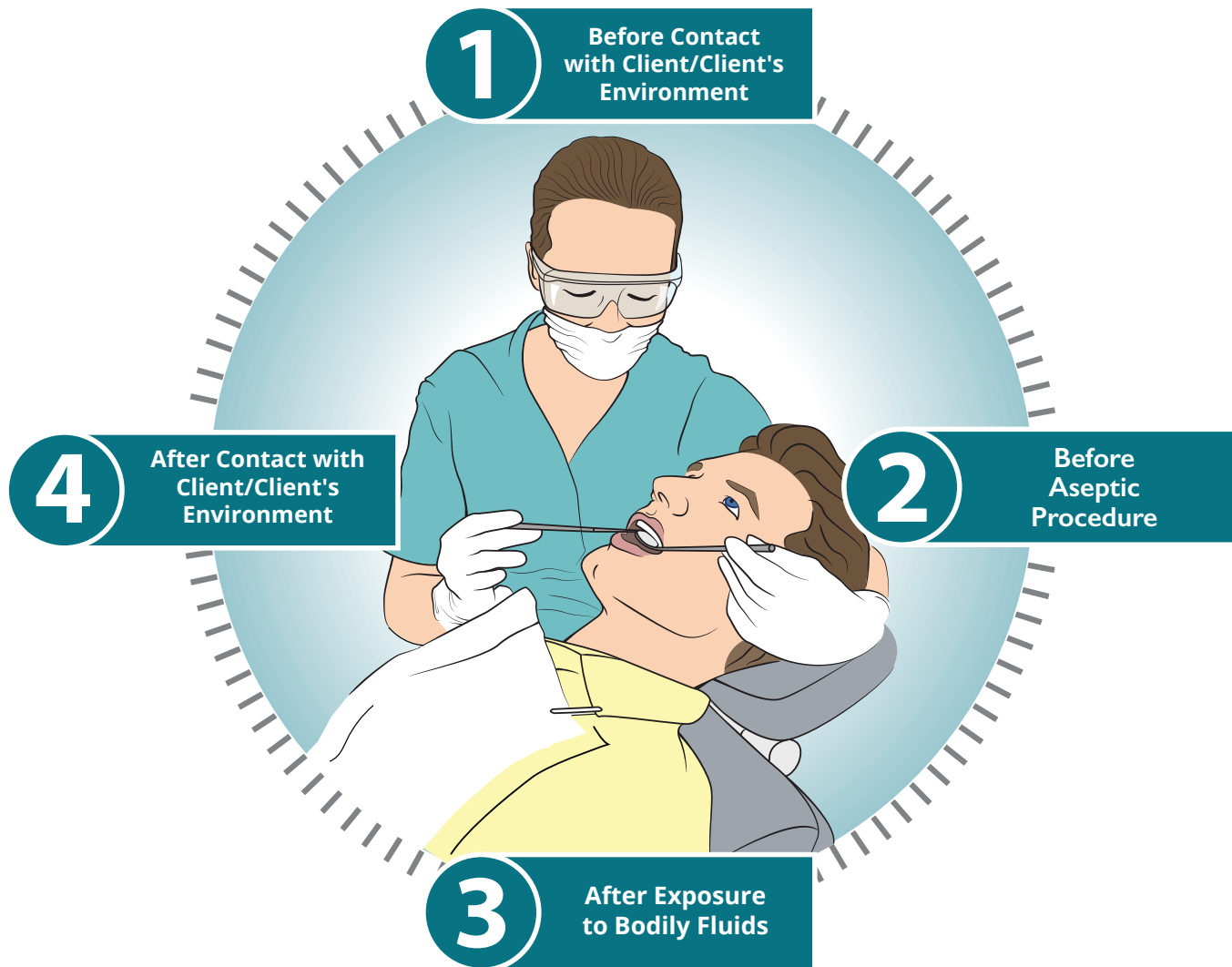


Your 4 Moments for HAND HYGIENE



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1	Before Contact with Client/Client's Environment	WHEN ? Clean hands before touching a client or an object or furniture in the client's environment (e.g., the operator). WHY ? To protect the client from harmful germs carried on your hands.
2	Before Aseptic Procedure	WHEN ? Clean hands immediately before performing a clean/aseptic procedure (e.g., before giving an injection). WHY ? To protect the client from harmful germs, including the client's own, from entering their body.
3	After Exposure to Bodily Fluids	WHEN ? Clean hands, with soap and water, immediately after a procedure involving exposure risk to body fluids (e.g., after being exposed to saliva or blood). WHY ? To protect yourself and the environment from harmful client germs.
4	After Contact with Client/Client's Environment	WHEN ? Clean hands after touching the client or an object or furniture in the clients's environment (e.g., the operator). WHY ? To protect yourself and others from harmful germs.
