Overview

The Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) is Canada's national communication standard for hazardous workplace materials. This training module introduces learners to the essential components of WHMIS, including hazard classification, labelling systems, pictograms, and Safety Data Sheets (SDS). This module emphasizes understanding the risks, recognizing hazard symbols, reading labels, and identifying key information in SDS to maintain a safe and compliant workplace environment.
